Knitting Small Circumference Piece In Rounds on Any Size Circular Needles

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Normally you would knit small circumference pieces such as sleeves, socks and mittens on 3-4 double pointed needles.

You can use following method as an alternative .

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Skill Level:

- Beginner.

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1. Cast on required number of sts plus 1 extra st.



2. Pull one needle out if you used both needles.



3. Slide sts to the cable.



4. Divide sts in half and pull the cable out creating a loop in that spot.



5. Slide sts to the needle points. Make sure the edge is not twisted and you are facing RS. RH needle is with working yarn end.



6. Connecting in rnd: slip last cast on st from RH needle to LH needle.



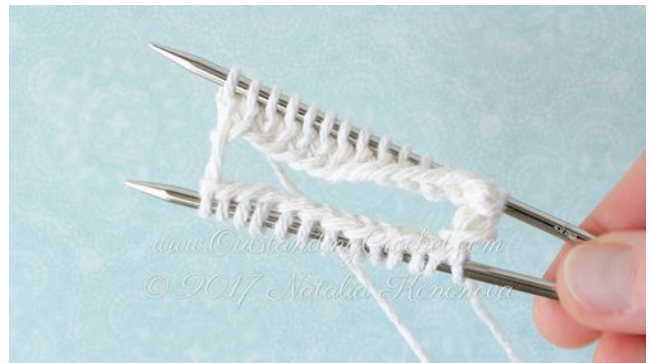
7. Pull RH needle out with enough cable for you to comfortably knit with it – about the length of the needle.



8. Knit (or purl, depending on your pattern) 2 sts together – last cast on extra st and 1st cast on st – rnd is connected. Knit all sts from LH needle.



9. *When you finish LH needle drops.



10. Pull cable so sts from the cable slide to LH needle.



11. Pull RH needle out again with enough cable for you to comfortably knit with it.

12. Knit 1st st from LH needle. Pull working yarn with force to tighten last 2 sts.



Because of the gap bet needles last 2 sts may be left very loose if you skip this step. Knit rem sts. Place marker on cast on rnd to mark beg. Repeat from *.
